




It sounds obvious but all of us here at Maroon View have decided to dedicate this week's program to the cup winners. Please enjoy all the images and the pull-out poster!


The fans have played a massive part this season and we will need them with us until the end of the season as every game is going to be a battle.

Enjoy the game.



The Night of October 11th 2022 will forever remain a keystone in Ireland's proud footballing history. A moment in time, whose ripples are growing stronger and travelling wider than anyone could have ever imagined.

As Amber Barrett's 'International Goal of the Year' as voted for by the Soccer Writers' Association of Ireland, slithered deftly across the Scottish line, Ireland's place in the FIFA Women's World Cup Australia & New Zealand 2023 was cemented.

There's possibly a little-known fact about Galway United's current green away kit, designed by the club with technical sponsors O'Neills Sports. The shades of 'Athenry Green' and the shamrock motif emblazoned on the nape of the neck, were directly inspired by that moment. While it was clear to us all 2023 would be a memorable one for the Women's game, we could have never dreamed what the 'rub of the green' truly had in store closer to shore.

Since the Autumn of 2022 there has been a tidal wave of support for the International women's game. Long overdue, it feels the immense dedication and technical prowess of the women's sport is finally getting the recognition it deserves from fans and the media alike. The mantra #Outbelieve defines this momentous journey for the Irish Women's National team.

Coinciding with this wave, Galway United launched their first-ever Women's team. Under the impassioned leadership of Phil Trill. The team have surpassed all hopes in their inaugural season.

Winning the immediate respect and love of the United fan base, Phil's side has grown from strength to strength and was more than deserving of their place in the inaugural Avenir Sports All-Island Cup Final Sunday last in Sligo.

As Galway United, lined out once again in green and gold, a shirt whose very inception stems from that now infamous Amber Barrett goal. It was immediately clear there was to be only one voice in The Showgrounds on the day. Only one team were truly destined to take home the trophy.

The travelling Maroon Army shook the Stand F rafters to their foundations and fuelled by this swell of support, United's female heroes led by Lynsey McKey dispensed the Cliftonville challenge with as clinical and rousing a performance as ever seen in a Galway shirt.

in the 11th minute was the defining moment that sealed Galway United's first senior trophy in 25 years.

It was an honour to be standing on the terrace, my son proudly by my side, cheering on this simply brilliant Galway team.

While Ireland's 'Girls in Green' are at this very moment proudly representing us in New Zealand and Australia. Closer to home we now have our very own 'Heroes in Green.'







#### What are Shin Splints?
