EDITORIAL

elcome to UCD for tonight's crucial game in the SSE Airtricity League First Division.

It has been a good start for the Students, with eight points from their first four games, and Galwegians will have noted that Donal Higgins was among the goals for Andy Myler's men last weekend, in an impressive 4-1 win over Cabinteely.

We also wish former United underage player Adam Farrell all the best at UCD this season.

It has been an underwhelming start for United and we have been especially ineffective in the first half of all of our games. We were second-best against Shelbourne, 3-0 down against Athlone and 1-0 in arrears to Limerick at the break.

On the plus side, the changes John Caulfield made showed the depth of the squad, and there was plenty of spirit shown to get an unlikely draw against a decent Treaty side last weekend.

Much of that chat this week has been about a proposed European Super League. The Premier League's big-six clubs - Manchester United, Manchester City, Liverpool, Arsenal, Chelsea and Tottenham - were all due to be involved.

AC Milan, Arsenal, Atletico Madrid, Chelsea, Barcelona, Inter Milan, Juventus, Liverpool, Manchester City, Manchester United, Real Madrid and Tottenham Hotspur have all joined as 'Founding Clubs'. It was anticipated a further three clubs will join ahead of the inaugural season, which, according to the clubs, was "intended to commence as soon as practicable".

German giants Bayern Munich and Borussia Dortmund were not included and nor were French champions Paris Saint-Germain. Nor were Galway United.

As of Tuesday evening, Chelsea were preparing to withdraw, as were Manchester City. It all seems to be falling apart. Perhaps this was a power-play from the big clubs to get more of what they want; perhaps they never really intended on taking part in a Super League, or not in the near future.

Football has for much of its existence been a working-class game. The ticket prices to get into big games in certain countries now, including England, are in danger of taking it away from the working class. The pandemic has meant that football has had to rely on revenue that did not involve people attending.

It was thus encouraging to see the reaction of fans across England who roundly rejected the idea of the Super League. They may support Manchester United and Liverpool but they are little different from you or I: they support their local team through thick and thicker, or in our case thin and thinner.

We can feel a real sense of detachment from all of this, given the realities of life in the League of Ireland, but we can feel a bit of pride too that we are grounded in reality, and that fans are what matter in the game here, and that we want them back very soon. It's a redundant thing to say but true to say: there will not be many easy games for United this season. Already, this has become evident. Tonight is another big one.

Enjoy the game.

t has been an extremely competitive start to the SSE Airtricity League First Division season. That is evident every weekend: the games are proving to be extremely hard fought.

We know that from last year: winning breeds confidence. So far the lads have been very close. An important thing for me is that if I thought we weren't giving it our all or we weren't working hard enough or the lads weren't working hard enough at training; that hasn't been the case.

Ultimately it is vital that we remain composed because we have put a brand new team together. We are a club with no real history of success, we came in trying to change the mindset and the atmosphere around the city and county. This won't happen overnight; it will take time and patience, but make no mistake we are trying to build, to put blocks in place, to see can we be successful.

Sometimes people think winning is easy but if you look at our history we don't have that history other clubs have. Creating that winning mentality is crucial. Sometimes the players are taking a bit of criticism, unfairly, I think. It might be a surprise to some of them, but at the same time I'm sure that once you start putting a few victories together you get that bit of momentum.

I'm confident that the lads will have a good season. Ensuring the squad has plenty of depth is hugely relevant. Having competition for places is key as you need strength in depth. We were unfortunate with Francely Lomboto's injury before the start of the season but we have guys chomping at the bit to get playing. I think throughout the season that will be tested and we will need guys showing form off the bench, and you could see that against Treaty United. Since returning Colin Kelly has worked really, really hard. He has the head down, he is learning quickly, and we have high hopes for him. Wilson Waweru came in he made a great impact too, getting his second goal of the season. Mikey Place did well when he came in, Mikie Rowe too; you need impact, you need guys coming off the pitch to make an impact.

They all did and I'm happy with the attitude of the lads. It was also great to have Killian Brouder and Ronan Manning involved. I think we all know Ronan Manning's potential. He is an exceptionally creative player, he missed most of pre-season so it was brilliant for him to get 60 minutes under his belt.

While some people believe we should be doing better, we have implemented a full-time training approach and there will be an adaptation period. Overall I think we need to be more clinical converting chances, especially when you have a team such as UCD coming to Eamonn Deacy Park. They have been heavy scorers, netting ten in four games so they will carry a real attacking threat. We have been creating opportunities, but we need to take more of them. I firmly believe that we can have a rewarding campaign, the players are working extremely hard, and they will deliver for Galway United.

Padraic Cunningham has rejoined Galway United, having previously played for the club between 2014 and 2017. Club reporter Tom Byrne sat down with the striker to discuss his first spell at United, joining up with the Galway Gaelic footballers, and his hopes for the current season.

Padraic Cunningham says that as a kid playing underage football in Galway, a certain ex-Manchester United partnership was never far from his mind, inspiring how the striker has looked at the game ever since.

"My idols growing up were always Wayne Rooney and Cristiano Ronaldo," he says. "The two of them built such a bond and that had a big impact on me, in terms of trying to be like them on the pitch."

Cunningham started out with local side Moyne Villa, before joining Mervue

United while still in his first year at Presentation College, Headford.

"I left Moyne Villa at under-13s and went to Mervue United with two of my mates from Headford," he says. "I played with Mervue up until the League of Ireland under-19s team, whom I played two seasons for, and then I signed for Galway."

In Cunningham's first season with what was at that time Galway FC, his side secured promotion to the League of Ireland Premier Division under the guidance of Tommy Dunne. Galway defeated UCD in the 2014 play-off final, which Cunningham describes as a massive moment in his career.

"It was an excellent season," he says. "I was learning from great players there at the time like Jake Keegan, Enda Curran and Vinny Faherty. They are all top strikers and I learned a lot from them.

"Tommy was also a great coach," he adds. "He used to keep me behind in training sessions and did one-to-one work and trained me very well. That season was brilliant for me personally as well, because I was so young and I gained valuable experience."

Cunningham spent four seasons in his first spell at the club, which included three campaigns in the Premier Division.

"We had a great campaign under Tommy in the 2016 season before we, unfortunately, got relegated the following season," he says. "We actually had a great team that year we got relegated. The standard of players that were there was unbelievable. David Cawley, Ronan Murray and Gavin Holohan were three class players, and we also brought in a quality player in Rory Hale. "Even though we went down, it was probably my most enjoyable year and I learned a lot during it," he adds. "I was learning from seasoned pros, which helped me progress as a player. You are coming up against top-quality sides like Dundalk, too, who were playing in Europe. Hopefully, those days will stand to me this year and help me to push on to develop in this league campaign."

When Cunningham left the club in 2017, the striker had a decision to make when it came to the career direction he would take. He opted to trade sports and play for Galway in Gaelic football, after turning down the opportunity to join John Caulfield's Cork City, who were playing in Europe that season.

"It was probably the most difficult decision I had to make yet," he says. "They [Cork] had just sold Seani Maguire and they were looking for a striker. I spoke with John and went down to Cork to spend a day at

the training ground. I can see now that John has brought the same professionalism to Galway that he brought to Cork. It really did tear a hair out of my head for ages, trying to make a decision, but in the end I chose to give the GAA a go.

"I don't regret the decision I made and thoroughly enjoyed my time playing for Galway GAA," he adds. "I got to know some of my best mates, so it was a good few years. I did miss the football and was always keeping up to date with Galway United. I would have always tried to get to a match at Eamonn Deacy Park. I did miss it though, as I loved the scenario of training full-time and being a professional player."

After Caulfield took charge of United the pair spoke again, and "Podge," as he is better known, became the first signing





made by United ahead of the 2021 League of Ireland season.

"I spoke with John and he is a very ambitious man which was a key factor for me to come back," he says. "He has the drive, the determination and he is also a winner. Listening to him, getting tips off him, is enormous for us as players. For myself as well, he was a great striker, so I try to take it all on board."

Cunningham has been impressed by the new coaching staff since his arrival and is keen to learn all he can during full-time training.

"All the coaching staff are brilliant," he says. "The training sessions and drills are very professional and very enjoyable. Learning from John, Lisa [Fallon], Gary [O'Connor] and Colin [Fortune] five days a week is much better than three times a week if it were part-time. You can really work off of each other every day, which is a great help."

On a personal level, the 24-year-old

has given himself targets to hit for the campaign. Podge has started all three of United's First Division games to date.

"Well, the obvious aim is to be in the first team, playing well and helping the team to reach the goal of promotion," he says. "I have given myself targets to hit. If I am in the team I need to be scoring goals, as that's my job as a striker. My main two goals would be working hard for the team and scoring as many goals as I can.

"We need to get out of the First Division and to be playing against the best teams in the country week in, week out," he adds. "There are some great teams in the division so it's going to be a very competitive league, but we have to turn every screw ourselves and hope we are at the top of our game each week."

Cunningham is delighted to be back at United, and says he's proud to wear the maroon no matter what the sport.

"It is massive for me to have played for Galway in both sports," he says. "I am a local lad, grew up in Galway and I have always been playing with Galway town teams. That year we got relegated took a lot out of me as a player, but I want to bounce back. This can be a huge year for Galway United and I want to help get the club back to the Premier Division. For me, I love playing for Galway and I love playing for the city."

Galway United draw 1-1 with Treaty United at Eamonn Deacy Park after a last-gasp Wilson Waweru equaliser.

In what was a historic first encounter between the two clubs, Treaty United kicked off proceedings on an immaculate Eamonn Deacy Park surface. After a scrappy opening exchange, the first opportunity of the game came the way of Galway United in the ninth minute. Ronan Manning found Ruairi Keating with an inch-perfect cross-field ball but the attacker's strike was well saved by Tadhg Ryan.

The match came to life when Treaty United took the lead in the 17th minute. Edward McCarthy headed past Conor Kearns after a superb cross by former United man Marc Ludden to give the away side the advantage.

Treaty began to grasp a hold of the game as Tommy Barrett's team held a strong defensive shape while the Tribesmen searched for an equaliser.

In a half that lacked any real clear-cut opportunities, United went into the break 1-0 down after McCarthy's goal midway through the first half.

The Tribesmen got the game back underway in the second half, in the


hunt for an equaliser.

Early second-half chances fell to Killian Brouder and Shane Duggan but both were unable to find the net.

Treaty United almost doubled their lead in the 60th minute after Alan Murphy was sent in on goal from an impressive through ball from Sean McSweeney but Kearns saved his effort effectively.

The double substitution of Mikey Place and Colin Kelly injected some life into the game while United began to push players forward as the clock ticked by.

Cunnigham almost brought United level in the 73rd minute when the ball fell at his feet inside the area but Ryan did well to get out in front of the striker to stop the effort.

It looked likely that the away side were going to bring all three points back to Limerick but the Tribesmen dramatically drew level in the 94th minute. Conor McCormack lofted a freekick into the penalty area which fell at the feet of substitute Wilson Waweru who blasted home from close range to make it 1-1 right before the full-time whistle.

Post-match reaction from John Caulfield:

"Treaty are a good side and they work hard. We probably dominated possession but they were dangerous in attack and got a very good goal in the first half. "We did have opportunities to score, Tadhg Ryan made two very good saves. The subs came on and made a difference to the game but it is still disappointing to draw it.

"We didn't do enough to create a number of clear-cut chances and we weren't as sharp as we would have hoped. I thought in the second half we were better but we aren't scoring enough goals at the moment.

"In fairness to Wilson, it is the second game he has come on and scored, which got us the point.

"Overall, it just didn't happen for us tonight. Treaty played well on the counter and defended well. We didn't do enough at times to win."

What do you make of UCD's chances this season?

We are better defensively than 2020 albeit with slightly less grunt up front with the departure of top scorer Yoyo Mahdy. UCD to make the playoffs.

How long are you supporting the team?

Actively off and on since the tail end of the 1980/'81 season. My friend Charlie was secretary of the UCD Superleague, which is an internal fun league for students and he was in my politics lecture. In March 1981 we had a friendly with Vancouver Whitecaps (in MLS currently bit back then in the original NASL) who were managed by Johnny Giles. We had borrowed four of their younger players at UCD for their close season and we were officially opening the changing rooms at our old ground Belfield Park. For this game we had to give back our loanees. The game ended 1-1; I went to seven home games the following season.

Are things solid off the pitch?

Yes, the club raises funds through the deeds of former scholarship players, who organise golf outings, poker nights and an annual dinner for former players to raise funds for scholarships, as well as persuading their employers to support the club by funding scholarships and perimeter advertising in the Bowl.

Who should we be looking out for?

Sam Todd in defence, Liam Kerrigan and Sean Brennan in the middle of the park, and Dara Keane and Colm Whelan in the attack.

Do UCD have a weak link?

It's the strongest squad with a younger age profile we have ever fielded so a bit of inexperience is the main weak link.

What's your prediction?

UCD to get at least a point from the game.

Will you be at the match?

My role as a broadcaster means I will be doing previews of the league on Friday Sports desk at the Dublin City FM weekend preview show. So I can't make it.

nother week and more history being unearthed...

The good news is I don't have another match to update you all on - tonight will be our 1563rd competitive match!

A target to aim at for our players is our 2000th goal - that should come this year - or there will be a very unhappy manager as we're currently on 1968 goals, so 32 in the remaining 23 league and cup games remaining should be manageable (then again we only scored 32 in 22 matches last season so it's not a certainty)

Of those goals - 97 were scored by Paul McGee - and 1 so far by our goalkeeper tonight Conor Kearns! He was credited with an own goal while playing against us for UCD! This is one of 41 OGs scored for us. To be fair to Conor the jury is out on OGs by goalkeepers when, as in this case, a shot rebounds off the crossbar or post, off the diving goalkeeper's back and into the net. The counter argument is if the goalkeeper wasn't there the goal wouldn't have been scored by the player who took the initial shot - I'm not sure this jury is ever going to return!

Of course UCD are our opponents tonight for the 59th time, the first coming on 11th November 1979 in which a 1-0 home win was secured. United/ Rovers are shading the contests by 23 wins to 19 with 16 draws, though UCD have scored 3 more goals than us 67 to 64.

It will be the 12th meeting in Division 1 with United having 4 wins to UCD's 3 and 4 draws.

A strange fact about the fixture is that each club has a winning record in the away fixtures.

UCD have played away to Galway United/Rovers 26 times with 9 wins compared to 8 for Galway and 8 draws, while United/Rovers have had 32 encounters away to 'College' winning 15 times and losing 10 with 7 stalemates.

As for the archive, I've finally reached the stage where I have starting line-ups, substitutes and goalscorers for each of the previous 1562 matches! I have received some records from others who have done similar and I'm now working through where a few players' appearances are 1 or 2 out to check whether I have missed any substitutions that may have occurred.

What has been established is that Kevin Cassidy, with 368 appearances, leads the way. Cassidy featured as a sub in the very first fixture way back on the 5th August 1976 at home to Athlone Town in the League Cup and made his final appearance on the 3rd October 1993 at home to Dundalk - both matches finished scoreless!

An unusual end-of-season match played on a Tuesday but 5 days before the teams met in the FAI Cup Final, which had the same scoreline. Playermanager Tom Lally made 8 changes to the starting line-up for the cup final on the Sunday, so this was very much a team of fringe players that season -Brian Gardnet, Jimmy Nolan and Kevin Cassidy the only players who appeared more than 10 times in the whole season.

As well as reaching the cup final, United achieved a record high league placing, up to that point, of 6th that season. Rovers achieved their 2nd league title of their famous 4-in-a-row and went on the clinch the double later that week.

United finished 8th and beat Bray in a one-off playoff to remain in the Premier Division for 2011.
