

## **EDITORIAL**

t is a privilege to welcome back some fans to Eamonn Deacy Park this evening, even if we are hopeful of having a full house very soon.

For those elderly fans who loved the fix of a live football game every Friday, the last 15 months or so have been really difficult. Over a year ago, United personnel were looking at ways to have the over 65s come to games here in a safe way, yet it never transpired that we were able to put our ideas to the test, as the pandemic would simply not go away.

Speaking to Liam Holton of Future Ticketing earlier this week on the LOI Central podcast, he opined that we have as a state been lagging behind others in many respects of our response to the crisis. I have felt that crowds should have been allowed back into football games a long time ago, but decisions were made or not made and now it is our responsibility to show that it can be done safely, and that we can have allow much bigger crowds in to help the team.

As a club official or journalist, I have attended quite a few games over the past 12 months or so. I have stressed many times to those who felt they were missing out: it has gotten extremely tedious, nothing like the experience of having fans present. Football like this would, I feel, have a short shelf-life. Even the TV product suffered massively, with top-level games becoming boring.

Would our position in the table be better were fans at Terryland since the start of the season? The evidence suggests they probably would. A relatively new team, with quite a few pretty young local players, would surely develop an affinity with local supporters

this season. As it is, our home form has been pretty hit and miss, and I've long argued that without fans, on a decent surface with little difference in climate, home advantage makes little difference.

The volume of away wins behind closed doors suggests that supporters make a huge difference to the result of football games. Moreover, the admirable response of those fans of the clubs who wanted to form a breakaway Super League in Europe showed that fans can still matter, even if clubs are less reliant on them paying in than was the case before.


John Caulfield sounded quite aghast after the Shelbourne defeat but the reality is there is a long way to go this season and he appreciates that he has good, hungry players. As both he and Conor McCormack note in their notes this evening, having fans back in the ground will be a help to United at a time when we desperately need a few good results. We have been unfortunate with injuries, red cards and so on, but that does not matter and we have to battle on.

We welcome you all back, including Athlone Town and their supporters this evening.

# FROM THE DUGOUT



fter the first third of the season during the break we were simply hoping to recharge the batteries. When you get the break I think it is good for everyone to recharge, to reflect on where we are at.

Once you get that rest you start to look ahead and we are excited about this evening's game. Some of our injury situations have cleared up which is another positive for us.

Obviously Athlone started the season incredibly well. They won a good few of their early matches and this league is very competitive. At the start they blazed a trail to open a gap early on. This league has shown that week in, week out anyone can beat anyone else. At the moment we are trying to see can we get a win under our belt, to try to get some consistency into our game.

I have maintained from the very start of the season that it was going to be very competitive with Cork City and Shelbourne relegated; a lot of other teams invested. Covid, with the no crowds, has certainly made home advantage not as big as you'd imagine when you'd have crowds.

We had a lot of new players coming in for this campaign. You could argue there were a number of games we were unlucky in, but at the same time you make your own luck. Ultimately after the first ten matches we are mid-table and we need to be in a higher position than that.

There has been a lot of good stuff, but the break gives you time to reflect and maybe make a few switches around with the team. At the same time it is good for the players who have all been back in since February. They have all worked hard. I keep saying they are a


good group and sometimes a couple of players just haven't performed to their best. Hopefully now that we have all got a bit of time off, they have come back in, and we are looking forward to the Athlone game.

It is another massive challenge, Athlone are a very good side. We feel that after the break we need to get our performances right on the pitch.

One great thing is that we will have some supporters back at Eamonn Deacy Park which is a real boost. I have been up here since last August; we got a run to the play/offs, we had a couple of games where we had 200. Thankfully we will have 100 back, hopefully it is the start of it over the next number of months, that we will get crowds back. I'd love to be walking into Terryland with no restrictions; that you could have a couple of thousand people at a match.

Hopefully that day is coming soon. It has been frustrating: no matter what anyone says playing without crowds is a disaster. From a management point of view and I have met thousands of people since I moved up to Galway, I'd love to be in Terryland meeting our own supporters and hearing that roar and noise coming from the stands.

I think that would help our team - the sooner it happens the better. At least this is a step in the right direction.



# CAPTAIN'S LOG

e are relishing the opportunity to get back out at Eamonn Deacy Park. With 100 supporters set to cheer us on we are hoping we can give them something to go home and be proud of us come the final whistle.

We know our last result was a very poor one and one we've had a long time to reflect on with the mid-season break afterwards. I thought we had turned the corner with positive results at home to Wexford and away to Cork in games leading up to the Shelbourne game. Unfortunately defensive mistakes cost us badly once again.

Every player has come back after the break well refreshed and ready to work hard again. There's a third of the season gone so far and we haven't really started to play to our full potential yet; there is a lot left in us but we need to make sure that starts this Friday.

It's going to be a very tough game against Athlone so we will have to be ready for them. They turned us over to easily the first time we played them this year so we will be out to make sure that doesn't happen and do our best to beat them.

It's going to be a big difference Friday night: even though there will only be 100 Galway supporters in the stadium I've no doubt they will help us do the business and get the result. I can't wait until they stadium will be full but for now we've to use this as an advantage.

# WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

rom Chick Deacy to David Forde, some top-drawer footballers have worn the colours of Galway Rovers and Galway United. Each week in 2021, we will talk to an ex-player to recall old memories and find out what he is doing nowadays.

Gordon Brett played for both of tonight's sides and he remains heavily involved in football. A popular figure in Terryland in the 1990s, he was a very talented player.

# When did you start playing for Galway United?

Summer of 1994.

# What was the high point of your time at Galway?

Beating Sligo Rovers 2-1 (Ricky O'Flaherty scored twice after we were 1-0 down), it was the first game back in the re-opened Terryland Park as it was then. Massive crowd and great atmosphere that day. Scoring a late equaliser versus my then former club Athlone Town for Galway is not far behind! Genuinely, I'll never forget the support of the Galway fans that night.

#### What was the low point?

Relegation at the end of the 1995/'96 season.

# Who was the best player you played with?

Probably Michael O'Connor for his overall ability and goalscoring levels even though I didn't really get to play with him in his prime. Dennis Clarke was the best professional I played with and a top midfielder. I have to mention Tommy Keane, Derek Rogers, Stephen Lally, Ollie Neary, Mark Herrick and Ricky

O'Flaherty also. I loved playing with Adrian Carberry if we were both paired together at left back and left midfield together. (Sorry that's more than one!)

# Who was the best player you played against?

Pascal Vandequin of Derry City was a serious operator. Technically good, physically tough and super fit. A proper professional.

#### When did you finish up with United?

The end of the 1995/'96 season. I should have stayed but was getting worried about my degree studies in Athlone Institute if Technology and the traveling commitment. Good career decision but a bad football one as Dennis Clarke was making me a good offer to stay and I had a great end to that season personally.

# Do you still follow the team's fortunes?

I always follow GUFC's fortunes and I am very much in touch with lots of my former team mates especially Derek Rogers and Ollie Neary.

# Did you have any pre-match superstitions?

My only superstition was to NOT have a superstition, if that makes sense? I tried not to let my head get wrapped around a certain pre-match routine and in fact often would try to do something a small bit different before each game either in the warmup up or with food etc.

#### Tell us about your family.

I'm married to Clare who is a secondary school teacher and we have two kids, Lucy (15) and Bobby (13). Lucy loves Gaelic football, hockey and tennis



while Bobby plays with the Athlone Town under-14s.

#### What do you do now?

I'm the Head of the Sports
Department at Athlone Institute of
Technology (soon to be renamed
The Technological University of the
Shannon). I am head coach of the
Athlone Town 14s squad and do video
clips and analysis for Adrian Carberry
and his first team. I also commentate on
the live streamed Athlone home games
with another former Athlone and Galway
player, Tom Silke.

# Tell us about the Galway managers you worked under.

I played under Tony Mannion and Dennis Clarke. Tony had some brilliant stints as Galway United manager but of course he's originally from Athlone so that's no surprise! We still chat a few times a year. As above, Dennis was the best professional I met in the game and was one of my heroes as a kid. I wish I played under him for longer. My youth was spent watching him win trophies for Athlone with other local players Padraig and Michael O'Connor and of course Noel Larkin.

# What is your prediction for tonight's game against Athlone Town?

It's a massive game for both teams. Athlone were far better in the first encounter but Galway are slowly coming together. I expect it to be tight and there is a contrast in styles. I'll go with Athlone 2-1 but really wish both could achieve promotion to the Premier Division. Galway as a city should be able to sustain a successful Premier Division outfit and things are improving every season in Athlone from the Academy right up to the first team.

# **MATCH REPORT**

# SHELBOURNE FC 4 GALWAY UNITED 0

Galway United defeated 4-0 by Shelbourne at Tolka Park.

It was an even opening to the game as chances fell to Shane Farrell and Ruairi Keating early on but both were unable to hit the target.

The first clear-cut

opportunity came the way of Michael O'Connor in the 24th minute. The striker controlled the ball in the box but Conor Kearns was up to the task as he saved his deflected effort that was bound for the top corner.

O'Connor got his goal a few minutes later as he opened the scoring in the 26th minute. After a stray pass by United from a free-kick, O'Connor hit a speculative effort from outside of the area that deflected past Kearns to put the home side in front.

Shels continued to control the first period but United created some opportunities as the half Photos : Ger Ryan

went on.

In the 38th minute, Conor McCormack supplied a teasing cross from the left wing which Maurice Nugent headed goal-wards but the defender was unable to direct the ball on target.

Shelbourne did look dangerous on the counter-attack, and they doubled their lead in the 42nd minute. O'Connor struck for a second time as his effort from outside the area deflected off a United player again to make it 2-0 on the stroke of half-time.

Shels went into the break two goals to the good.

The home side gained a three-goal advantage early on in the second period as Yoyo Mahdy scored for Shelbourne in the 53rd minute. The ball fell to Mahdy outside the box and the attacker finished emphatically into the bottom corner.

Both sides created chances at either end midway through the half. Kevin O'Connor came close for Shels while Shane Duggan came close with a long-range strike for the Tribesmen.

As United committed players forward, Glen McAuley put Shels four goals in front when he tapped the ball into an empty net after a quick counter-attack to make it a resounding lead for the home side in the 81st minute.

Table-toppers and unbeaten Shelbourne were worthy winners as they beat United 4-0.

# Post-match reaction from John Caulfield:

"Shelbourne are a very good side but the most disappointing thing is that we have made too many mistakes in this first third of the season and we have given away too many poor goals.

"There is a lot of

work to be done in the next two weeks and a lot of hard decisions to be made. Many of the players haven't performed to a level I would have hoped for and we have two weeks to get it right.

"Ultimately, I feel sorry for the club and the supporters. You need to have the determination and the spirit to go out onto the pitch and do it, you have to leave it all out there. Unfortunately tonight, we haven't performed across the white line.

"At the end of the day, we gave them a couple of soft goals which is frustrating. The only thing is that it is the first third of the season but we have to turn it around very quickly."

#### FOR THE RECORD

rivals Athlone for the 103rd time in our history, a fixture that has occurred more often than any other in our history at League of Ireland level.

Athlone Town were our very first opponents in the 1976 League Cup when the clubs played out a 0-0 draw, while Athlone were also the opposition for the very first home win when Galway Rovers registered a 3-2 win on November 27, 1977 thanks to a brace from Paul Martin either side of a Shay Doyle goal.

Overall we have a winning record with 39 wins against 33 for Athlone and 30 draws. Should United score tonight it will be the 150th goal scored against Athlone, while Athlone have registered 138 themselves, including eight in one game in an 8-0 League Cup drubbing in 1981, which still equals our worst ever defeat.

Some 76 of the 102 meetings so far have come in the league and unfortunately half of those 76 meetings have been in the lower tier with United holding an 18-12-8 record of results in Division 1.

Some notable milestones have been reached by United players in recent games. Stephen Walsh made his 211th appearance for the club in Cork recently, this puts him outright 18th on the all-time appearance list with Vinny Faherty on 214 the next target.

Padraic Cunningham has the next most appearances of the current squad with his 90th appearance coming in the home match against Wexford; he is now on 92 and should become the 57th player to achieve 100 games for the club later this season.

Maurice Nugent clocked up his 70th game in the most recent match against Shelbourne, while Carlton Ubaezuono played for the 50th time in the draw in Cork.

Should they feature tonight Conor Kearns, Conor McCormack and Gary Boylan will all be hitting double figures having been involved in every game so far this season. 317 players have reached ten appearances for the club, some of the most notable players having played exactly ten are the now-professional-golfer, Stephen Grant, former manager Don O'Riordan and Korean import Yob Son.
