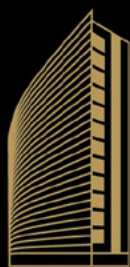

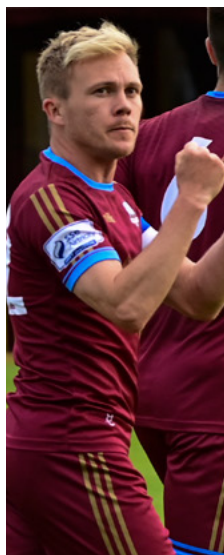

On last week's LOI Central podcast, Conor O'Grady was our guest.

I put it to the former Sligo Rovers player, now the club's head of academy: why have Sligo Rovers won so much, as opposed to Galway United, with a population of roughly a quarter (per county)? The obvious answer is that Sligo has few distractions in terms of other sports and that is the best that I could come up with too.

As Sligo returned to European football this week, the club was on something of an all-time high. It is challenging at the top of the Premier Division, in a healthy place financially, having launched plans for a redeveloped Showgrounds and having recently had a staggering six players start for the club in a league game who came through its academy.

We spoke after Sligo footballers had been humiliated by Mayo and there's little doubt that with Galway a uniquely diverse area in terms of sporting success, we have different challenges here. According to O'Grady, there has been little unity in terms of the clubs in Galway with a common purpose. Others may disagree but it has been so encouraging to witness what has happened of late.

Alan Murphy seemed to have a genuine ambition to bring as many young players through to senior League of Ireland football as was possible in his spell as manager. When his namesake Alex returned to the United starting 11 for the UCD game last weekend, it seemed to suggest that the 16-year-old is now John Caulfield's main player to start at left-back.

At the other end of the park, Wilson Waweru scored for the second time in three games, both beautiful goals. We may reflect on the successes of Caoilfhionn O'Dea, Colin Kelly, Ronan Manning, Maurice Nugent, Francely Lomboto and Chris Horgan as others who came through the academy.

The academy is a work in progress and we need to sell to government how important it is for the underage structures to work at League of Ireland level. We are far too reliant on volunteer coaches, who deserve embellished plaudits as, in a country with a functioning football industry, they would be entitled to be well-paid.

The knock-on benefits are too great to even contemplate for functioning academies. Our international team has fallen to a sorry state of affairs and that is clearly related to the failure of the League of Ireland, both at senior and underage levels.

To see John Caulfield rely on some local players, many of them who did not play underage for Galway United for various reasons, is really heartwarming. What is the point of a club unless it has players or aspires to have players from the community?

Our superb form continued at Belfield and the lads will be bullish about another win tonight but Caulfield will have them warned that Cobh can be tricky. It's still very disappointing that we cannot welcome the fans we want into Eamonn Deacy Park and we can only offer our continued thanks for your patience and support.

Enjoy the game.

Galway United continue impressive winning streak with a 2-0 away victory over UCD at the UCD Bowl.

The Tribesmen made it four wins on the bounce thanks to goals from Ruairi Keating and Wilson Waweru in either half.

It was a bright start from John Caulfield's side as they created chances early on. Mikey Place and Wilson Waweru looked sharp in attack with Place coming close on two occasions midway through the first half.

The opening goal came courtesy of a Ruairi Keating volley in the 30th minute. United played a long ball into the striker's path and Keating made no mistake as he finished emphatically past Lorcan Healy to put the away side one to the good.

UCD retained possession well throughout the first period but were unable to truly test United keeper

Conor Kearns before the break.

The killer blow came straight after the interval in the 47th minute thanks to a superb Waweru goal. The attacker showed a touch of class as he skilfully rounded the UCD defender and confidently slotted it home to put United two goals in front.

The away United support chanted merrily around Belfield as the Tribesmen efficiently saw out the game. David Hurley and Keating, who were excellent throughout, could have put United further in front before the final whistle but both were unable to convert.



Caulfield's spirited outfit ran out convincing winners in this evening's clash at the UCD Bowl which brings them into second place on the First Division table.

Post-match reaction from John Caulfield:

"We are trying to create a winning mentality and get the club back into being very competitive. We want to bring joy to the club and the supporters.

"This is our third clean sheet and I thought we were really solid. Our work rate was tremendous and

we got two fantastic goals. I felt we were well in control of the game and didn't look like we were going to concede.

"You need guys leaving everything on the pitch when you are challenging for games. The team are beginning to gel, we have put four wins together and there is more confidence in the players.

"Thankfully we are back up the table but there is still a long way to go. Now we get prepared for the Cobh game next week."

The winning goal came via a deft header by Padraic Cunningham 2 minutes into the second half, the first shot on target of the match. Conor O’Keeffe swung

in an inviting cross from the right-wing and Cunningham beat Treaty centre half Clyde O’Connell to glance the ball past sub keeper Shane Cusack who had replaced ex-United custodian Tadhg Ryan in the first half.

Indeed Cunningham himself was a first-half replacement for Wilson Waweru who took a knock to his back just before the half-time interval and had to be replaced. The two first half substitutions were about the most notable action in a pretty dour but physical first half, an early Stephen Walsh effort glancing off the outside of the Treaty post from a chipped

ball through by Killian Brouder the nearest either side came in the first half.

John Caulfield elected to make just one change from the side that beat Cabinteely 1-0 last week with Stephen Walsh returning from suspension at left-back in place of teenager Alex Murphy. Given the physical nature of the contest, it proved to be a wise decision.

The win, the third in succession for United, lifted the team to joint second in the table with UCD, who are next week’s opponents in Belfield.

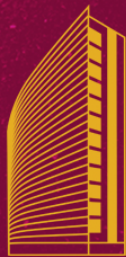

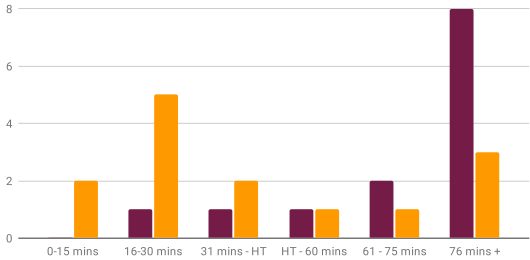

Tonight marks the 1,573rd match in the club's history and 391st in the "regular season" First Division. Tonight's opponents are also the answer to "which club have we faced most often in Division 1?" A question you've probably never thought to ask!

This will be the 43rd meeting between the clubs in the lower tier with United having registered 20 wins to Ramblers' 13 with nine drawn encounters. In total it will be the 61st meeting between the clubs in all competitions and should be score two or more goals Cobh will become only the fifth club that we have scored 100 goals against: Athlone (151), Limerick/Treaty (140), Finn Harps (125) and Sligo Rovers (103) being the others.

Meanwhile there were a couple of points to note from last week's win against UCD:

Wilson Waweru scored his tenth goal for the club putting him into the top 50 of all-time scorers for the club, joining teammate Stephen Walsh, Jason Molloy, Ryan Lucas, Karl Sheppard and Carl Humphries, from 1980/'81, on double figures.

Last week was also the fourth league win in a row; five wins in a row were of course achieved in the first five games on John Caulfield's reign last season but three successive wins with clean sheets had last been achieved in 2014 with wins over Waterford (1-0), Shamrock Rovers II (3-0) and Finn Harps (3-0).

The last time four clean sheets in a row were earned was going across the 2008 and 2009 seasons, finishing the 2008 Premier Division season with wins

over Finn Harps (3-0) and UCD (1-0), while the 2009 season opened with wins over St Pat's (3-0) and Dundalk (1-0).

Both 1997/'98 into 1998/'99 saw United win five League games in a row all with clean sheets but the feat of winning four games in a row while keeping a clean sheet has never happened in one season, a record both John Caulfield and Conor Kearns will be looking to set tonight I'm sure.

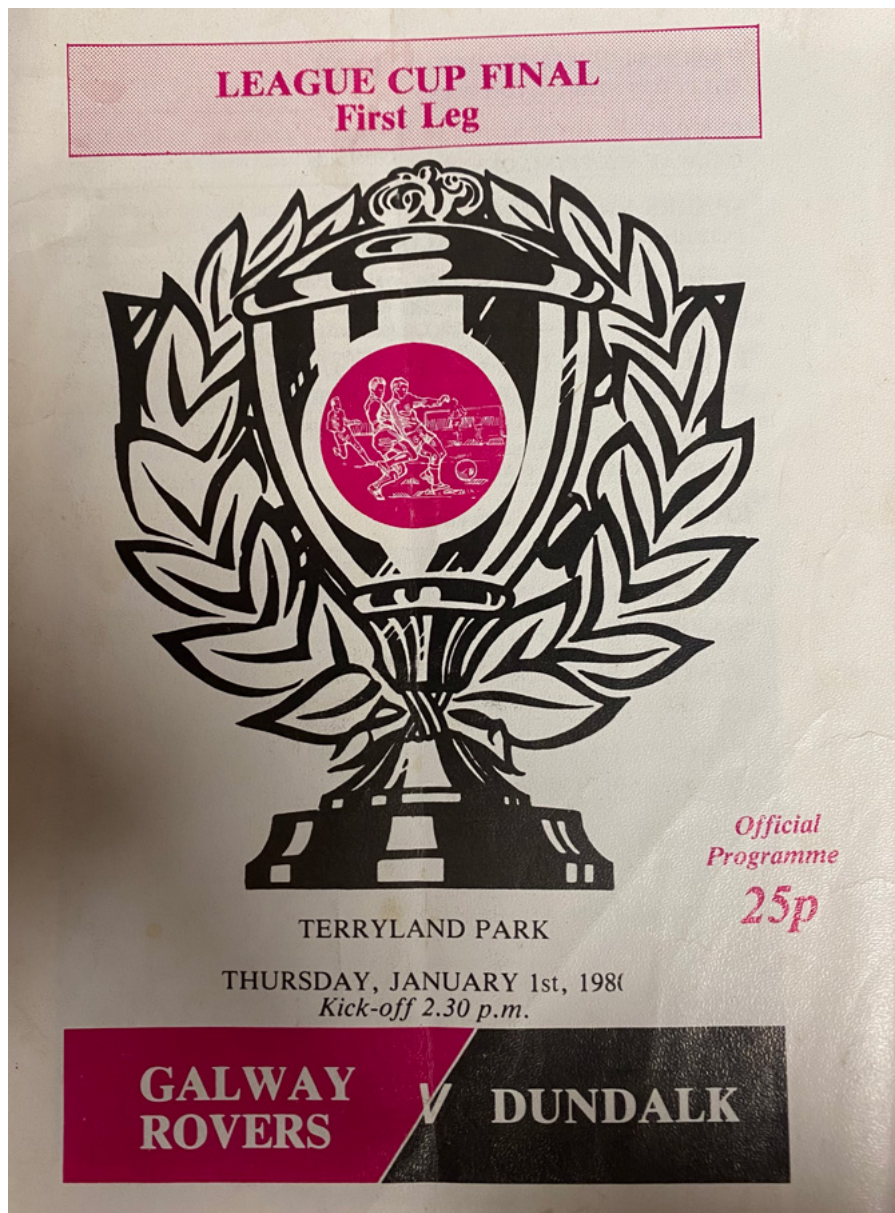
