## Dry Needling

Many people have heard of Dry Needling but few are aware of what it actually is or how it works. Dry Needling is the act of using acupuncture needles in a specific way to help alleviate muscular issues, and associated referred pain patterns around the body.

Dry Needling addresses muscular Trigger Points (commonly known as a knot) in the muscle. It encourages muscular relaxation, increased blood flow and release of toxins held within the muscle.

Some patients report immediate results and some require a days rest post the treatment before results become apparent.

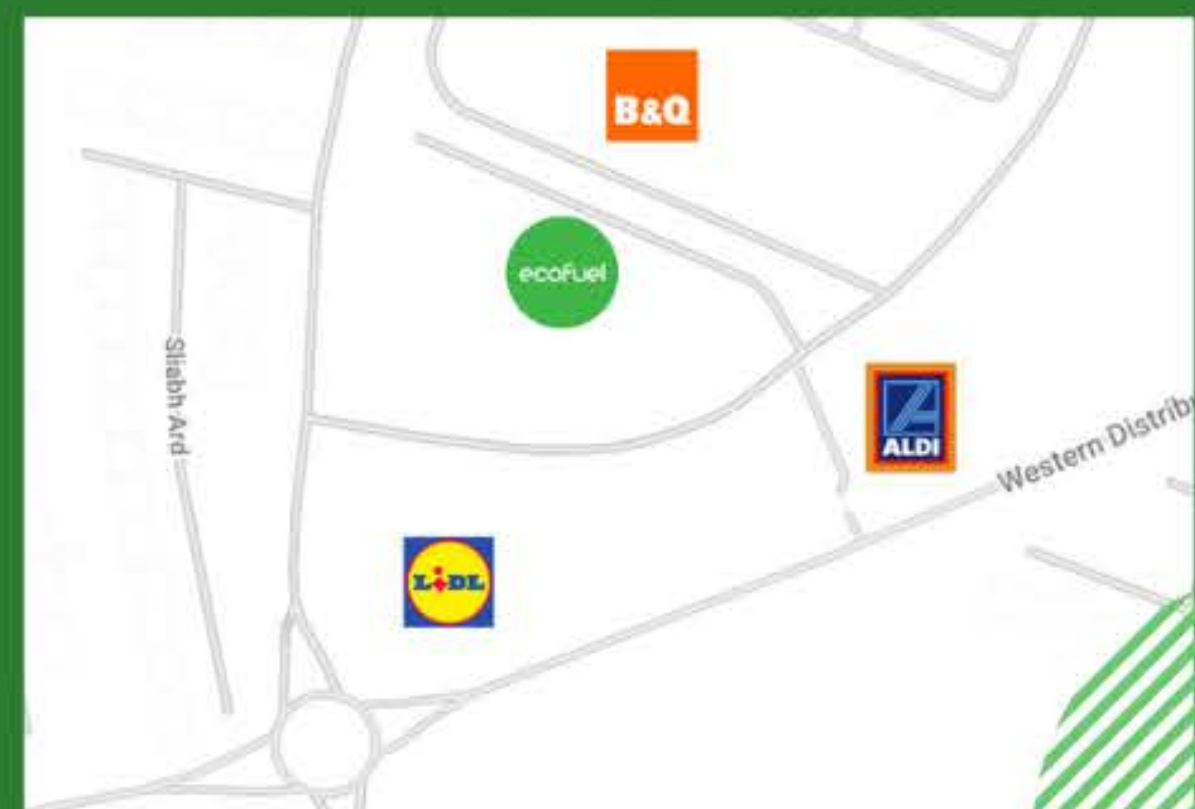

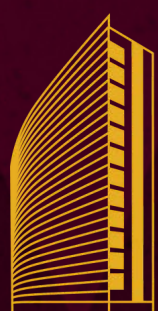
