TRILL OPTIMISTIC CAOMHÁN O' CONNELL

A small piece of Galway footballing history was registered on Saturday the 11th of February, when Galway United fielded their first women's team in a pre-season friendly against Sligo Rovers.

A Galway team with an average age of 19 eventually succumbed 2-1 but did much to encourage their manager Phil Trill ahead of their forthcoming campaign.

Speaking to Maroon View, Trill brimmed with positivity. 'I was really happy. We are at the stage where we are bringing the girls that have had the underage success to the fore. We are mixing that with experienced players.'

Many of the established Galway WFC players have been retained for the forthcoming season but some have been lost to competitors such as Athlone Town and Shamrock Rovers.

Trill is bullish however on the quality of his squad and enthusiastic about some final acquisitions. 'We are delighted with the signing of Isabella Beletic, a 24 year-old from Racing Louisville in the NWSL. She has played professionally at the highest level. We'll also announce one or two players in the coming weeks.'

The number of underage caps that exist in the squad backs up Trill's assertions on the quality of his players. Jenna Slattery, Kate Thompson and Aoibheann Costello will all be involved when Ireland Under-19s take on England.

Perhaps given this calibre, he is not concerned about the age profile of his squad.

'I wouldn't be too worried about being young. The past experience we have had shows that the Under-17 league was won with Under-15 players and the Under-19 league was won with Under-17 players. The age demographic of the league in general is young.'

Galway has a really strong history of producing underage talent. Our players are young but experienced. For example, Therese Kinneavy is 19 but has played 3 seasons at senior level. We will have a mix. The likes of Lynsey McKey will be a big player for us.'

Since this historic first outing, United played out a 0-0 draw with DLR Waves. They entertain Treaty United tomorrow, (Saturday the 26th of February) in their last pre-season game. However, thoughts are already creeping towards their first fixture against Wexford Youths on March the 4th.

'Wexford are going to be a really good test for us. They have recruited well. That's what you want. You want to be able to test yourself against the best.'

A mouthwatering prospect for football fans who have only a little over a week to await the start of a historic season for women's football in Galway and Ireland.
